# Interpreter Professionalism – A Municipal Framework

As stated in the *Code of Professional Conduct for Court Interpreters and Translators of the Rules of Superintendence for the Ohio Courts*, interpreters are "highly skilled professionals who fulfill an essential role by assisting in the pursuit of justice." Various canons speak of the high standards of professional demeanor, protocol and ethical responsibilities for court interpreters who "shall conduct themselves in a manner consistent with the dignity of the court and shall be as unobtrusive as possible."

During this webinar we will consider professionalism from a Municipal Court Interpreter Coordinator's perspective. We will share practices that enable us to maintain a professional demeanor before, during, and after assignments, with the goal of developing a framework for consistency. We'll also share some of the pitfalls and cautionary tales encountered over the past 20 years. From basic note-taking to invoicing, we will examine some generic court documents and incorporate them into a strategy for professional service.
